California Masonic Code

§804.140. STANDING OF DEMITTED MASTER MASON. A Master Mason holding a Demit shall remain in good standing for a period of one year following the date of his Demit. Should he fail to become a member of some Lodge within the period of one year from the date of the Demit, he shall not thereafter be entitled to any of the rights, privileges or benefits of Masonry, except the right to apply for affiliation. All Masons and Lodges are prohibited from holding any Masonic Communication with a Master Mason who has held a Demit for longer than one year, except as may be necessary to determine his eligibility to affiliate. A Master Mason holding a Demit shall remain subject to all of the duties applicable to him in the California Masonic Code, the General Regulations of Masonry and the Ritual, and he shall remain subject to the disciplinary jurisdiction of this Grand Lodge.
